

The Mat-Su Construction Academy is coming to an end, but will start again in mid September. We have successfully trained nearly 50 adults in various construction related areas, consisting of Plumbing, Electrical, Carpentry, and Welding, as well as safety classes, such as OSHA 10, CPR, and First Aid.

This fall, our Parade of Homes is schedule for August 13, 14, and 15. This spring we had 13 homes in our Showcase and we are anticipating an even better showing for our Parade.
